Arts Management Resources

1. Books, e-books and multimedia materials

Use the Library website Quick Search at www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk, to locate books, e-books and multimedia materials on your subject. You can search for specific items, such as those on your reading list, or to find out what is available on a specific topic. A demonstration of searching for a specific book can be found in Pilot, the University Library's online tutorial, at www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk/pilot/module1/1_2/2/index.html.

Useful directories at the Cambridge campus library include The Creative Handbook and The Performing Arts Yearbook.

2. Journal articles, research papers

The Library website at www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk provides access to **databases** containing journal abstracts, full text articles, market research reports and company information. To access these resources select Advanced Search, then 'Business' from the drop-down menu next to 'Journal articles, research papers etc'. Then select 'Arts Management' from the sub-categories menu. The page also includes links to relevant organisations, for example the Arts Council.

















Relevant databases include:



Database	Description
Academic OneFile	Journal and newspaper articles, most in full text (contains the content of Expanded Academic)
BHI (British Humanities Index)	indexes over 320 journals and newspapers on a broad range of humanities areas, for dates from 1962 to 2010
Business Source Premier	Journal articles, company profiles & SWOT analyses, country reports, industry profiles, product reviews, and market research reports.
Design and Applied Arts Index	articles from 450 journals on design and crafts, including film, graphic design, typography, illustration, photography
Emerald Fulltext	Full text journal articles back to 1994. Subject coverage spans a spectrum of management disciplines.
Hospitality and Tourism Complete	Scholarly research and industry news dating from 1965. Material includes company and country reports, and journal articles drawn from an extensive range of peer reviewed journals.
UK Newspapers Online	Access to the full-text of the Times, Telegraph, Financial Times, Guardian, Independent and associated Sunday papers.

You could also use the 'Database Finder' to go straight to an individual database.

You can find specific **journal** via the Library website by searching for a journal title in 'Journal finder'. This search includes both our electronic and print journals. To access the electronic journal articles you need to be logged in. Print journals are available in the Journals Collection, arranged alphabetically by title.

3. Resources from other Libraries

Books and journal articles that are not available either printed or online from the University Library may be obtained from another library by submitting an Interlibrary loan request. The form can be found by logging into the Library website and selecting Interlibrary Loan from the left-hand menu. There is a charge of £2 per item.

You may also wish to visit other libraries. See the 'Using other libraries' section of the Library web-site (www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk/helpdesk/others.htm) for details of other libraries that you can visit.

4. Internet Searching

Google Scholar covers peer-reviewed papers, theses, books, abstracts, and other scholarly literature from all broad areas of research. The University Library has now registered its holdings with Google so, **after logging in to the Library website**, its electronic collections can be accessed directly via the Google Scholar interface. It is possible to search Google Scholar and link directly to the full text of journal articles where they are available at Anglia Ruskin.
