

# Guide to...

## Dramatherapy

---

### 1. Books and other materials

Use the QuickSearch on the Library Web-site (at <http://www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk>) to find books, individual e-books, e-journals and other items on your subject. You will need to login with your University login username and password to use electronic resources. Useful classmarks or shelf locations on the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> floors of the library for printed books include:

**Audiovisual Materials** are shelved on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the Library and include films and recordings of television programmes on DVD and videotape and audio CDs. You can also search **Box of Broadcasts**, an archive of TV programmes, on the library website for relevant material.

**Please note** when searching on the library website or elsewhere that this area of study can appear as one word: 'dramatherapy' or two: 'drama therapy'. You may also find useful material using the subject term: 'drama, therapeutic use' and the broader term is 'arts, therapeutic use'.

### 2. E-Books

The University Library includes access to e-books, which appear along with the printed books in the Web-site's QuickSearch results. You can filter search results to see only e-books by using the 'Limit to' drop-down box. To access their contents you will need to log in with your University login username and password.

### 3. Reference Books

There is a small general Reference collection on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Library near the Enquiries Desk. A great deal of reference material is also available online via the Library Web-site, for example **Oxford Reference Online**.

### 4. Journals

Journals relevant to the subject currently stocked at the Cambridge Site library include those listed below. Titles marked \* are also available electronically, though e-access may include fewer back issues than the print journal. More e-journals on psychotherapy, mental health and drama are available in the Digital Library on the library website at <http://www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk> via 'Find e-Journal'.

To find articles on a topic, try searching relevant databases (see section 5 below).

### 5. Databases

To search the Library's electronic databases choose Advanced Search on the Web-site (<http://www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk>) and log in with your university login username and password. Choose Music and Performing Arts as subject. Then select *Music Therapy and Dramatherapy* as a sub-category to see a list of relevant databases and other online resources. The databases will help you to locate journal and newspaper articles on a specific subject and the Digital Library will link you to the full text where it is available. When the Library cannot supply the full text of an article, you can order it through our Inter-Library Loan service for a charge of £2. Databases covering Dramatherapy and related topics include:

**AMED** – (Allied and Alternative Medicine Database), journal article abstracts  
**ASSIA** (Applied Social Sciences Index and Abstracts) – international coverage, UK bias  
**Box of Broadcasts (or BoB)** – an archive of free to air TV & radio programmes  
**CINAHL** – full text articles on nursing & health  
**COPAC** – combined catalogue of leading university & research libraries in the UK & Ireland  
**Google Scholar** – links to our full text journal articles  
**Index to Theses** – details of theses accepted for higher degrees by UK and Irish universities  
**Intute** – search for organisations and website in this archive (no longer updated)  
**Medline** – (US National Library of Medicine) index and abstracts of biomedical literature  
**PsycArticles** – full text psychology journal articles  
**PsycINFO** – journal abstracts in psychology and related disciplines  
**Psychology and Behavioural Sciences Collection** – full text psychology journal articles  
**Science Direct** – full text scientific journal articles

**Web of Knowledge** – citation databases, including the Arts and Humanities Citation Index of journal articles covering 1981-present

**ZETOC** – index to journal articles from 1993-present

## 6. Research

Current research in your subject can be traced using the databases listed above. COPAC and Index to Theses are comprehensive tools for identifying useful material, but they will give little full text. If you require an item that is not stocked in the library, you will need to use our inter-library loan service (details at: <http://libweb.anglia.ac.uk/services/ill.htm>) or visit other libraries. Intute and other subject gateways (collections of evaluated web resources) can help locate relevant organisations and web-sites.
