Pastoral Theology

1. Books and other materials

Use the QuickSearch on the Library Web-site (<http://www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk>) to find books, individual e-books, e-journals and other items such as DVDs and videotapes on your subject. You will need to log in with your university login username and password to use e-books and e-journals.

2. E-Books

Individual e-books are available via Quicksearch, but there are collections of e-books such as: Ebrary, MyiLibrary and Dawsonera in the Digital Library via 'Books, e-books' on the left of the Web-site. Ebrary provides the full text of more than 25,000 e-books, covering most subject areas. MyiLibrary and Dawsonera are growing collections of titles in high demand.

3. Journals

Under the Digital Library heading, use the 'Journal Finder' on the Web-site to locate individual journals, print and e-journals. You can also look for articles by searching databases relevant to your subject (see below). Print journals can be found in the Journals Collection, arranged alphabetically by title. Relevant e-journals include:

Journal of Pastoral Counseling
Journal of Psychology and Theology
Pastoral Psychology

Articles in journals that are not available either in print or online from the University Library can be ordered by submitting an inter-library loan (ILL) request via Inter-Library Loan. 4. Databases

The Digital Library at <http://libweb.anglia.ac.uk> includes databases containing journal articles and other sources of information. Log in to the web-site and choose 'Database Finder' or 'Advanced Search', then 'Theology' from the drop-down menu. Relevant databases include:

Academic OneFile – journal & newspaper articles, most in full text
ASSIA – references and abstracts and some full text on applied social sciences

Box of Broadcasts – an archive of free to air TV & radio programmes
British Humanities Index – journal article references, some full text
Cinahl Plus with Full Text – health journal articles
COPAC – references to books and dissertations
Google Scholar – links to our full text journal articles
Index to Theses – references and abstracts to UK & Irish theses, some full text
Intute – search for organisations and web-sites in this archive (no longer updated)
JSTOR – an archive of full text journal articles
PsycArticles – full text psychology articles
Psychology and Behavioural Sciences Collection – full text psychology journal articles
Sociological Abstracts – journal article references, some full text
Swetswise – full text journal articles
UK Newspapers Online – newspaper articles in full text
Web of Knowledge – includes Social Sciences Citation Index, references to articles
Zetoc – an index of journal article references

5. Research

Current research can be traced by searching for articles in the various databases above and for references to books and dissertations in the database **COPAC**. You can also search for references to dissertations in the **Index for Theses**, which also has a small percentage of full text. Try **Intute** to locate relevant organisations and their web-sites.

6. Other Libraries
