School Resource Collection

Finding resources to support placements in schools and other settings:

The School Resource Collection (SRC) is located at our Chelmsford site library. The range of materials supports the curriculum from early childhood to young adult and consists of fiction and picture books, poetry, non-fiction, multi-media items, selected teaching schemes for reference and ideas to support lesson planning.

There is also a reference collection of practitioner material hosted on behalf of the Essex Skills for Life Professional Development Centre. (PDC)



Quick Search for books, e-books and other materials

You can use a range of subject resources from each section of the School Resource Collection to support teaching by theme or topic. Key teaching schemes are for reference only; other items such as children's books may be available for a long 70 day loan.

You can find items in the collection using the University Library website at www.libweb.anglia.ac.uk.

To use the library website **Quick Search**, type the subject or title you are looking for into the **Find results with** box. If you type SRC in the box, or use the drop-down menu to limit to 'School Resources' the list of results will be limited to this collection.

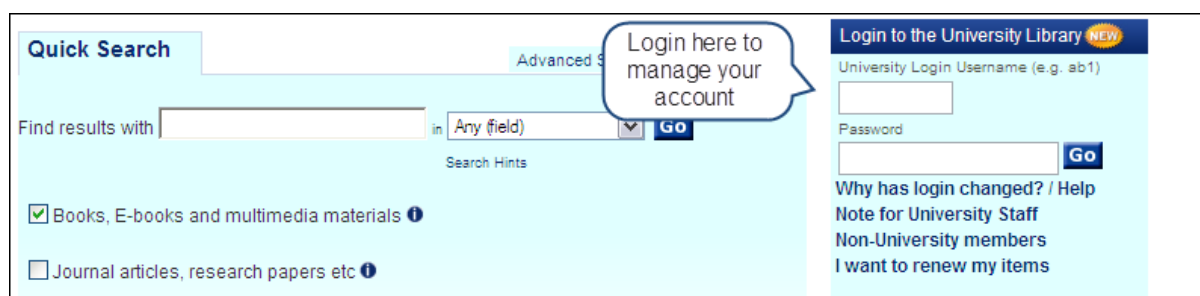

Resources for practitioners in the School Resource Collection:

Teaching schemes. (TS)

Teaching schemes support the planning of a programme of study through a structured framework. Each scheme usually has a teacher's guide explaining how the scheme supports teaching objectives. The School Resource Collection has examples of a range of schemes, for reference use only.

Schemes within a subject are given the same subject number and then arranged alphabetically by title e.g. Oxford Reading Tree TS 421.071 OXF

Ideas for teachers (TP)

This section contains resources to support planning across the curriculum. Titles are available for loan, with additional reference copies of popular items. It also includes material to support other aspects such as assemblies and personal, social and health education.

Alternative formats may include **big books, picture packs, DVD's and wall charts**. They may be stored separately, please ask if you need help finding them.

Resources for children:

Children's picture books (JP)

An extensive selection of picture books is held in the School Resource Collection. Titles in this format may be aimed at a range of levels, so the collection includes picture books for Foundation Stage through to titles aimed at Year 6 and above. The general subject term for the library web site Quick Search is **pictorial works**, which can be combined with another subject to find titles that support a particular theme E.g. pictorial works water

Children's stories (JF)

The collection contains titles at a range of levels, both primary and secondary. The general subject terms are **children's stories** or **juvenile fiction**. Titles should be evaluated for use with the target year group. If a title has the additional subject terms **teenage** and **fiction**, it is not advisable for use with pupils at primary level.

Children's information (J and shelf number)

The collection contains information books at a range of levels, providing a choice in matching subjects to level of understanding.

Type the subject in Quick Search combined with the letters **SRC** to display a list of items in the collection E.g. forces SRC

Children's poetry (J 821)

Children's poetry collections are shelved in the sequence of children's information.

The general subject term is **children's poetry**.

Individual poems within collections may not be indexed. If you want to trace poetry on a particular topic e.g. weather, and you have been unsuccessful using the subject search on the University Library website quick search, indexes to poetry may be helpful. They are located on the reference shelves (**TPR**) in the School Resource Collection.

The Poetry Library online at <http://www.poetrylibrary.org.uk> has an information service and specialist staff who can suggest poems on specific themes.

Journals

Journals may review new publications and provide current information on developments and research in children's literature and education. The University Library holds a wide selection of journals in paper and electronic formats.
