

How to...

Access ebrary e-books

Ebrary is a collection of ebooks that the Library subscribes to. The collection covers a wide range of subjects. They are accessible via the Library catalogue and you require the ebrary reader to view the titles.

Staff on-campus

Staff will need to install the ebrary reader on-campus. Go to the Start menu and then All Programs. Go to Network Applications, click on workstation configurations and then ebrary reader

Students off-campus


On-campus the student computers already have the ebrary reader installed. But you need to install the reader if you want to view any book off-campus

Enter your search term in the Library Catalogue and then click GO.

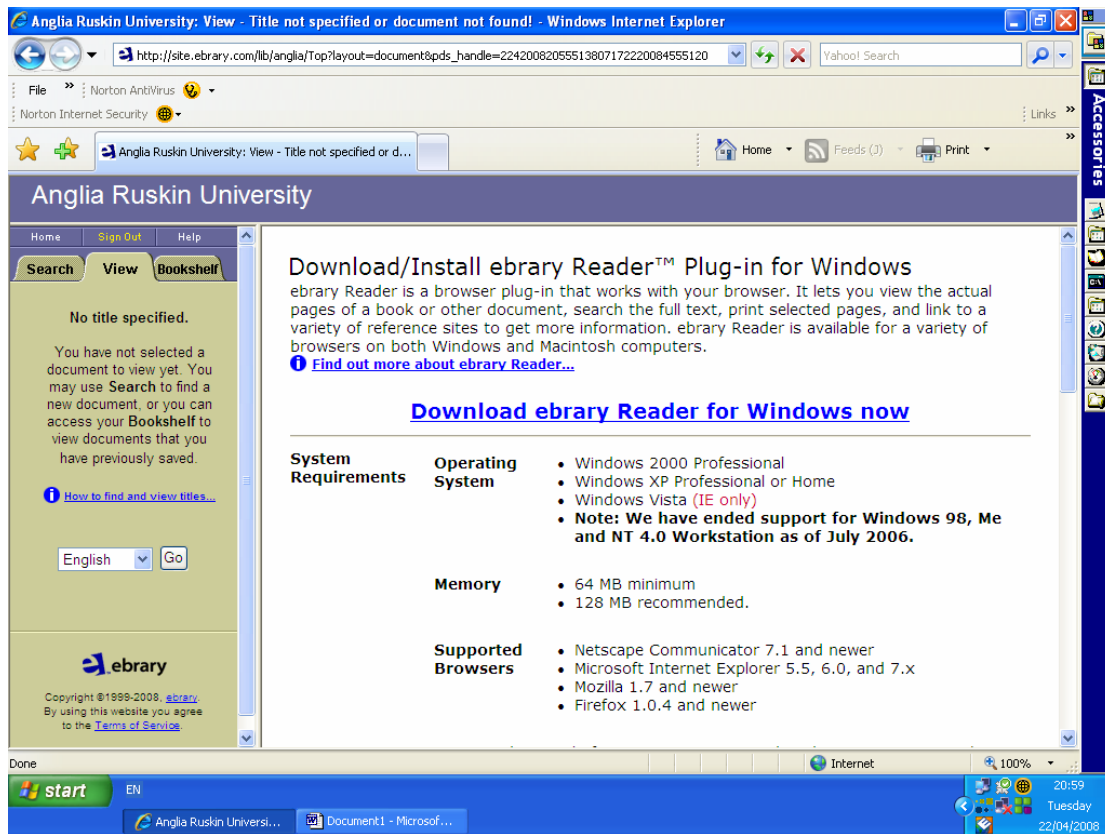

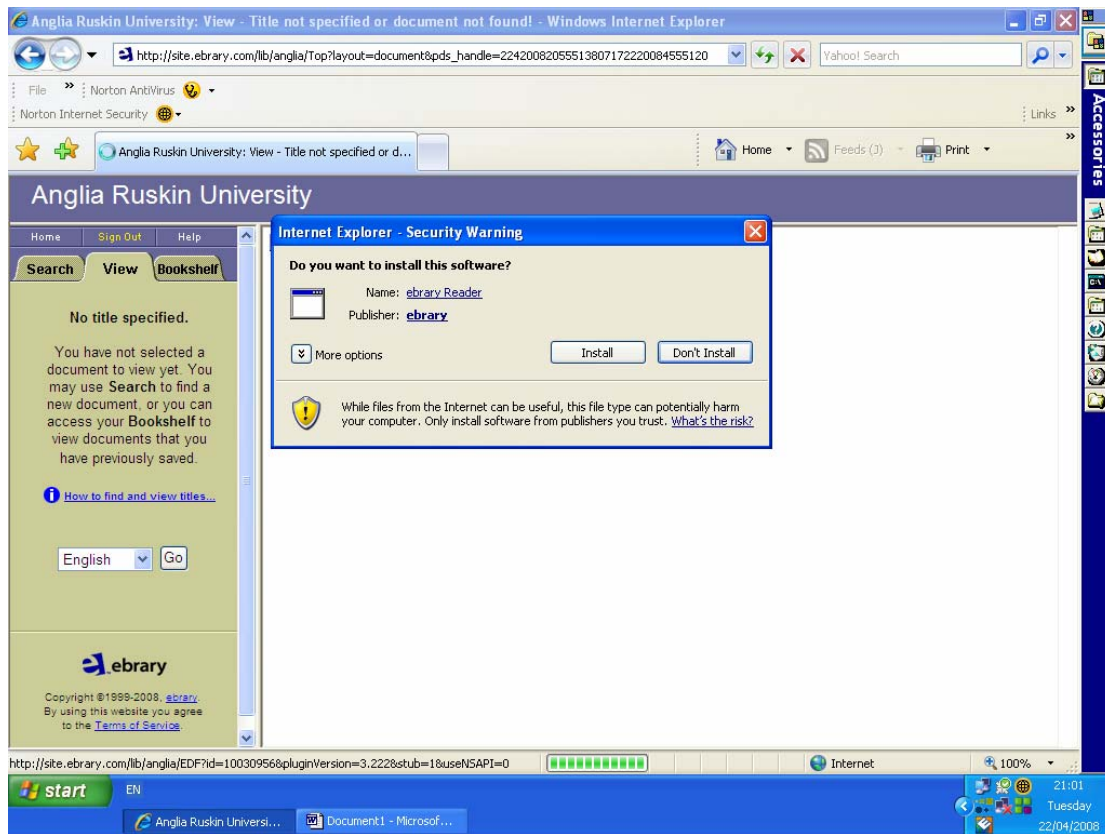
You can also login as a [Guest](#) to the Digital Library. This gives restricted off-campus access for non-members of Anglia Ruskin University.

You should be taken straight to the cover page of the book.

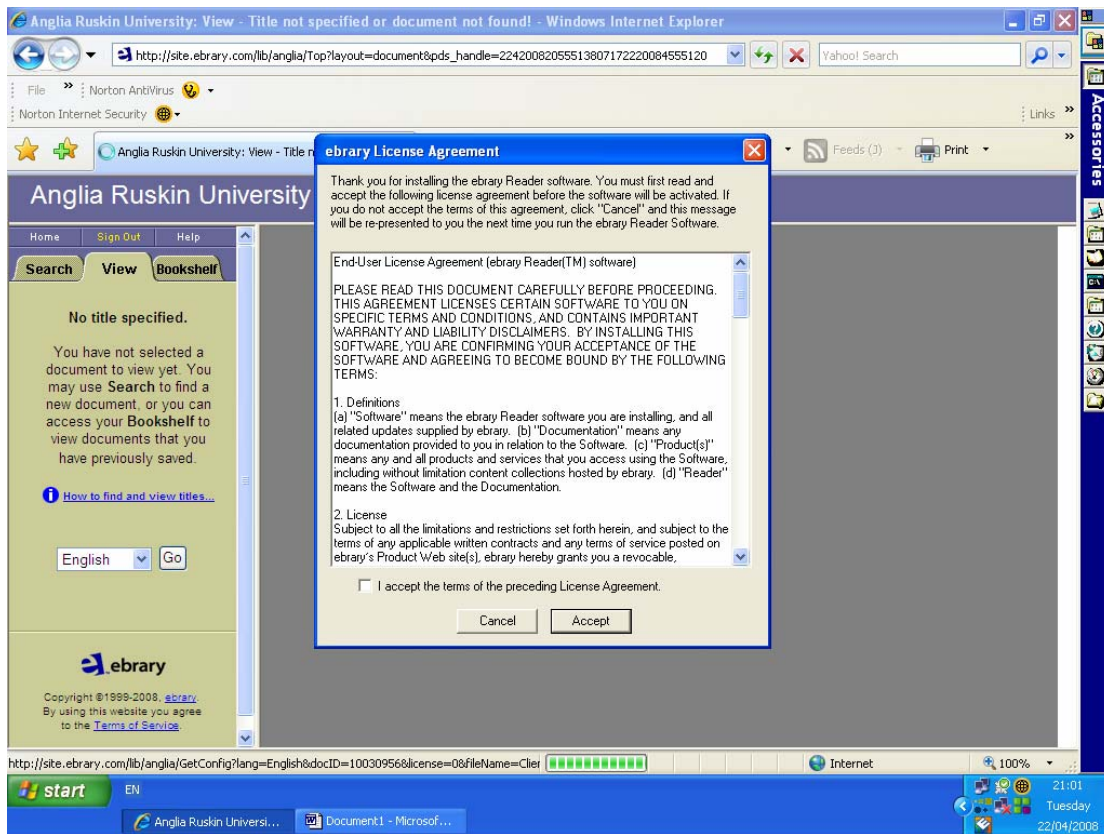
However if you are off-campus you need to download the ebrary reader
Click the Download ebrary Reader link



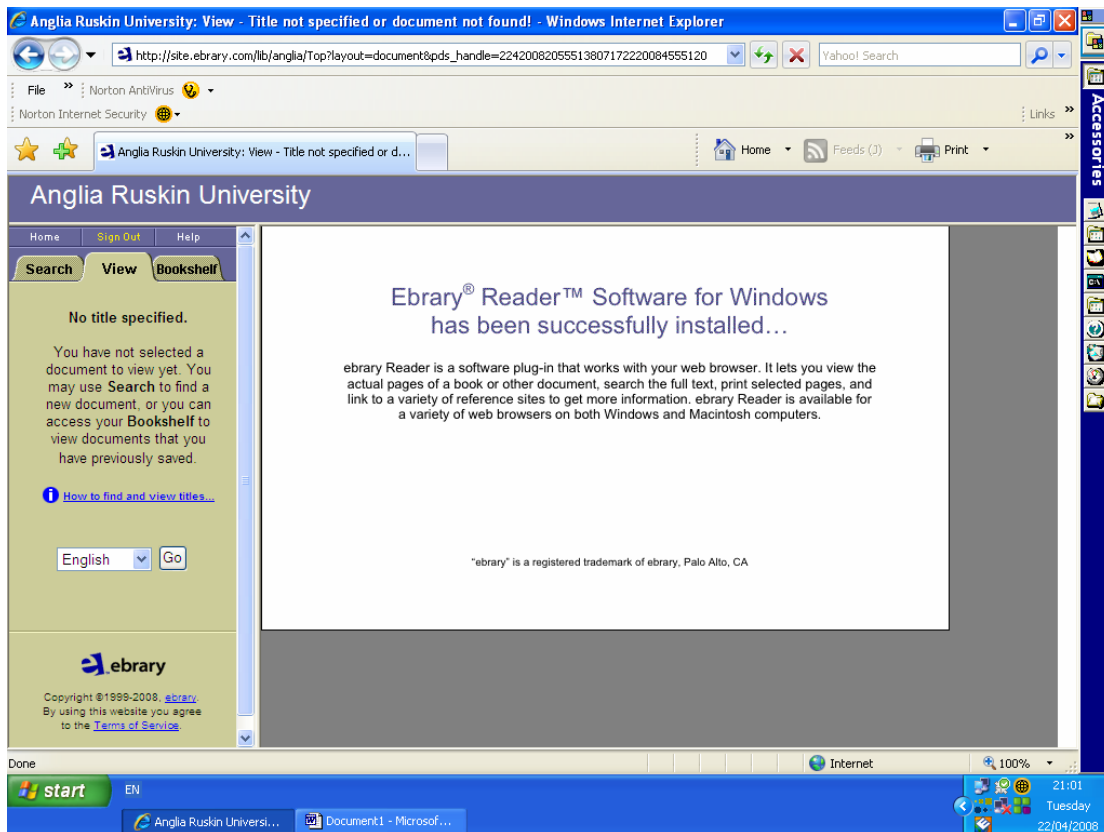
Then click the install button


